When we encounter that snag in the breath, that shadow of a wing, we hope to remember kindness.


Kindness cannot self-isolate. It moves both ways and all ways, like breath.


In this engaging, rollicking yet poignant sequel to *Lillian's Eden*, we see Maureen's ambition to explore the world encounter its harsh realities, and her mother Lillian using her resourcefulness and intelligence to tackle the ongoing family dramas at home.

This is a novel about women in the world in the 1960s, both in Australia and abroad, and their resilience and capacity to manage their lives at a time when others want to take that independence and decision-making from them.

ABOUT THE AUTHOR: Cheryl Adam spent her childhood in rural Australia where her love of storytelling began. In adulthood, she travelled widely and lived overseas including in Africa and Europe. She has been evicted, kidnapped, abandoned, made homeless and discriminated against in her foreign adventures and this helped develop her deep empathy for the plight of immigrant women. Her concern for marginalised women and the environment took her to the Philippines where she taught homeless women how to create useable art from plastic bags. This experience inspired her to begin a creative writing course at Holmesglen TAFE in Melbourne. Her first book was *Lillian's Eden* (Spinifex Press, 2018). Out of Eden is the sequel. She lives in Melbourne.

And little readers are invited to rest their heads and be soothed to sleep as moonlight falls on eyes that close.

ABOUT THE AUTHOR: Gillian Sze is the author of multiple poetry collections, including Peeling Rambutan, Redrafting Winer and Panicle. Her work has been nominated for the QWF's A.M. Klein Prize for Poetry, and has received awards such as the University of Winnipeg Writers' Circle Prize and the 3Macs carte blanche Prize. She studied creative writing and English literature at Concordia University and received a PhD in études anglaises from the Université de Montréal. Originally from Winnipeg, she now resides in Montreal, where she teaches creative writing.

ABOUT THE ILLUSTRATOR: Sue Todd is an award-winning illustrator living in Toronto. She is a graduate of the Ontario College of Art. Sue began her career as a freelance designer in retail advertising. For a more creative outlet, she took up linoleum carving, an ancient printmaking technique similar to woodcut, and developed a unique style of art that led to a career in illustration.





The son of Spanish immigrants born in Canberra, Andy Bernal's incredible life journey has spanned three continents —Australia, Europe and South America—and some of the world's biggest names in football. A graduate of the AIS, he was the first Australian to play in La Liga. He went on to play with Ipswich Town, six seasons with Reading, five seasons with Sydney Olympic in the NSL, and 21 games with the Socceroos from 1989 to 1996.

On retirement, he became an agent with global giants SFX, which included time spent with David Beckham in Madrid. The low points of his life included being arrested because of a link to a sting operation as part of a global media scandal, followed by further high points via World Cup scouting, and meeting the love of his life.

Ultimately, *Riding Shotgun* is also a tale of life, hope and redemption that is raw, honest and heartfelt.

ABOUT THE AUTHOR: One of the pioneers for Australian footballers, Andy Bernal is the son of Spanish migrants and grew up in Canberra at a time when immigrants and their families were made to feel unwelcome and racially vilified. Despite this, Andy's love of football, saw him emerge from the ACT to forge a career abroad, also becoming a professional in both Spain and England. IAfter his retirement, Andy became a football agent and was entrusted to be Manager in Spain to superstar David Beckham following his mega-move to Real Madrid from Manchester United. Following roles as a Socceroos scout and a Strength and Conditioning Coach, Andy now works as a global talent scout for footballers and UFC fighters.
