On 10 August 1936, James Joyce wrote a letter to his grandson Stephen. In the letter he told, in simple language, the story of how the Devil built a bridge across the river at the town of Beaugency. As usual, the Devil wanted a high price for his gift. But the clever mayor of the town outwitted the Devil by making use of the Devil's fondness for cats.


It was an old French story but Joyce gave the mayor the name of a famous mayor of his own home town of Dublin in Ireland: the popular politician and character, Alfie Byrne.

The story has since been published in picture book form, but it has long been out of print in English. This gorgeously illustrated new Little Island edition brings back the delightful children's story written by Ireland's greatest writer, author of the Modernist masterpiece Ulysses, James Joyce.

ABOUT THE AUTHOR: James Augustine Aloysius Joyce (2 February 1882 – 13 January 1941) was an Irish novelist and poet. He contributed to the modernist avant-garde and is regarded as one of the most influential and important authors of the 20th century. Joyce is best known for Ulysses (1922), a landmark work in which the episodes of Homer's Odyssey are paralleled in an array of contrasting literary styles, perhaps most prominent among these the stream of consciousness technique he utilised. Other well-known works are the short-story collection Dubliners (1914), and the novels A Portrait of the Artist as a Young Man (1916) and Finnegans Wake (1939).



He has been privileged to play for such icons as the conductors André Previn, Claudio Abbado, Karl Bohm and Mstislav Rostropovich and impresarios Sir Andrew Lloyd Webber and Sir Cameron Mackintosh.


In New Zealand, we were known as the 'Lost and Unwanted Generation'.

We were orphans, unwanted by our families and left in the hands of The Salvation Army. Many didn't survive—but Daryl Te'Nadii did, and he has lived to tell his incredible story of being an orphan in NZ, to living on the streets of Australia, and becoming an elite physical training instructor in the Australian Army.

ABOUT THE AUTHOR: Born in New Zealand, Daryl Te'Nadii was abandoned by his mother and orphaned as a baby. He grew up facing troubles no child should experience and overcame two suicide attempts and being homeless before the age of 15. Te'Nadii joined the Australian Army at the age of 18 and was chosen for an elite training position. He won 29 Australian titles and two international gold medals in powerlifting and body building. He currently resides on the Sunshine Coast in Queensland with his wife and daughter. Te'Nadii is an advocate for Men's mental health, having lost many close friends in similar situations to him, and his own son, to suicide.

A series of lucrative auctions of Canowie land commenced in 1909, culminating with the homestead and stud in 1925. That of 1910 was the largest single auction of freehold land ever held in South Australia to that time.

Exhaustive research now reveals the fascinating history of Canowie's exciting frontier origins, its expansion into prosperous corporate pastoralism, and then voluntary liquidation at the peak of its success, leaving a remarkable legacy to the Australian wool industry.
