






# ENCYCLOPEDIA OF SOCCEROOS CENTENARY EDITION, 1922 TO 2022

It is an alphabetical listing which provides biographical information, playing data and comprehensive appendixes that include maps, tables, and charts with every detail anyone could possibly want!

This is a second edition, completely updated for playing data up to the 2022 World Cup. It includes information on the 600+ players who have played A internationals for Australia, but also more than 325 who played non-A internationals – that is, as the national team but against a club or composite side, rather than another national side. The first edition was published in May 2018. The *Encyclopedia of Socceroos Centenary Edition 1922 to 2022* is one of three books from Fair Play Publishing in 2022 that celebrates the Socceroos Centenary.







During Australia's catastrophic Black Summer bushfires, a little town in the foothills of the Snowy Mountains found itself in the path of a megafront. Between November 2019 and February 2020, shocking bushfires burnt 18.6 million hectares of land and forests in New South Wales, Victoria and South Australia. These megablazes killed 34 people, destroyed thousands of homes, and claimed three billion mammals, birds and reptiles pushing some to extinction as their habitats were annihilated. On January 2nd 2022, the township Batlow, population 1313, on the edge of the Great Dividing Range, was declared 'undefendable' and its citizens advised to flee.

While most evacuated, many stayed to fight for their beloved community. And in the end, the undefendable town was saved by volunteers - by farmers, teachers, electricians, retirees, and boys barely out of high school. A great deal was lost, but much was saved, including Batlow's sense of itself. During and after the fires, the world's media descended upon Batlow. They told the story of the battle for the town, or the parts of it they saw. The townspeople didn't object to that, but later felt the need to tell their story in their own words; if for no other reason than to have a record for history before memories faded and legend and rumour expanded into the gaps. *Undefendable* is a collection of stories, poems, and photographs from the people of Batlow about those terrible days. Curated, by Sulari Gentill and Sarah Kynaston, to form a memoir of a town under fire, the stories and oral recollections have been only lightly edited to preserve the voice of each person and the community as a whole.

**ABOUT THE AUTHOR:** Sulari Gentill is the award-winning author of the 10-book Rowland Sinclair mysteries series, The Hero Trilogy (YA); and two standalone crime novels *Crossing the Lines*, and *The Woman in the Library*.



### THE TOWER Carol Lefevre

Throughout this winding story, Dorelia and the elderly artist Elizabeth Bunting are sustained by a friendship that reaches back to their years at art school, and bonded by the secrets of a six-month period when they painted together in France. The loneliness of not belonging, of being cut adrift by grief, betrayal, or old age, binds these twelve connected stories into a dazzling composite novel.

Within its complex crossings and connections, young and old inhabit separate yet overlapping firmaments; grown children, though loved and loving, cannot imagine their parents' young lives. For most, the past is not past, but exerts a magnetic pull, while future happiness hinges on retreat, or escape.

ABOUT THE AUTHOR: Carol Lefevre holds a PhD in Creative Writing from the University of Adelaide, where she is a Visiting Research Fellow. Her novel If You Were Mine (2008) was published by Vintage. She has published short fiction, essays, and journalism, and a non-fiction book, Quiet City: Walking in West Terrace Cemetery (Wakefield Press, 2016). 



### NOT SACRED, NOT SQUAWS: INDIGENOUS FEMINISM REDEFINED Cherry Smiley

**ABOUT THE AUTHOR:** Dr Cherry Smiley, PhD, is a radical feminist artist from the Nlaka'pamux and Diné Nations. She has worked to expose missing and murdered Indigenous women and with survivors of the prostitution industry. She has written for Globe & Mail, Policy Options, and Herizons.





Gender, we are told, is a spectrum, and it resides in the mind. In countries such as Norway, Canada, Argentina and Australia, laws have been enacted that give anyone the right to change his or her legal sex, irrespective of whether the person has had a medical procedure.

At the same time, the industry for gender reassignment surgery is growing at an unprecedented pace. Seven out of 10 teenagers who seek treatment are now girls.

**ABOUT THE AUTHOR:** Stockholm born, Kajsa Ekis Ekman writes for the Swedish daily Dagens Nyheter and is on the editorial collective of the anarchist magazine Brand. She has an MA in Literature from Södertörn University and is author of *Skulden - eurokrisen sedd från Aten* (Leopard Förlag, 2013). She has founded the network Feminists Against Surrogacy and the climate action group, Klimax.



Through his father he is Kwakwaka'wakw from the Kukwekum, Giiksam, and WaWalaby'ie clans of Fort Rupert, and Coast Salish from Cheam of the Stó:lo Nation along the upper Fraser Valley. Through his mother he is English, Irish, and Scottish. In his artistic practice he strives to highlight Indigenous, social or environmental issues. Carey was awarded the Meritorious Service Medal in 2017 and was named to the Order of British Columbia in 2018. With Kirstie Hudson, he co-authored *Picking Up the Pieces: Residential School Memories* and *The Making of the Witness Blanket* which was a finalist for the City of Victoria Butler Book Prize and the Norma Fleck Award for Canadian Children's Nonfiction. Carey lives in Victoria, British Columbia.




In the green days of youth-in another life and in a far land-Jack Dann was invited to participate in Native American religious ceremonies and culture. And in that far country of the past Jack experienced numinous moments and small revelations that changed his life and his art. Some of those distant moments and visceral wisdoms are encapsulated in Poems From a White Heart...a lifetime's distillation of poems birthed in the ice and fire of a lost America.

As he writes in his introduction, "During that initial white hot time of exploration and revelation, I asked a medicine woman to vet the early poems that now make up the spine of this book. I had wanted to publish them in magazines and literary quarterlies, but did not feel comfortable doing so without her permission. She read the poems...and gave me her blessing. And over the long years that followed-long after I had lost touch with those who conducted and participated in the ceremonies I describe-I continued to write poems for this book."



Tam's miserable existence flips when he discovers his AWOL father struck it rich in the Middle-East before dying and has left him 5 million. After trying to buy Manchester United (he claims to be a childhood pen pal of Alex Ferguson), Tam settles for a majority share in Guff Rovers, installing himself as the gaffer.

Tam, though, is dangerously out of his depth, sacking the entire team and buying in a hodgepodge of journeymen including a cleaner, a kebab van owner, a caber toss champion and half of Swindon Town's reserves. The club quickly spirals out of control teetering towards their first relegation into non-league football in their 99-year history and financial ruin as Tam Bam learns there's more to football management - and life - than he ever realised.
